Staff News – We welcome Mrs Hakes back from maternity leave after the half term. She will be returning to Acorn Class with Ms Butler.

Work Sharing – Year 6 parents are invited to go to the hall at 8.55am on 30th October (first day after half term) to share their children's work with their youngsters. Children whose parents cannot attend will stay in class for assembly. Parents need to be at school by 9am at the latest so that the children can be collected from registration as a group, rather than disrupting the learning of those in class throughout the session.

Mental Well-Being – On Monday in assembly we focused on staying mentally healthy as well as physically. If children would like to design a colourful poster (A4) encouraging people to 'Talk, Listen, Tell', work will be displayed around school.

Ofsted – I have been asked by a number of parents when our Ofsted outcome will be published. I am surprised we have not received it yet but you will be notified as soon as we hear it is available.

Lateness – Whilst most parents do a good job of ensuring their children arrive at school promptly we have noticed an increase in late arrivals in the mornings. It is important that adults encourage children to form positive habits with regards to time keeping in order to become successful members of society. The school gates close at 8.55 and registers close at 9 am and therefore children must be **in class** before this time.
