- Religious Education also has to be taught but is separate to the National Curriculum

What is different?

- ◉ Computing not ICT
- ◉ Fewer themes in more detail
- ◉ Facts as well as skills
- ◉ No more levels for assessment

English

- The spoken language
- Reading – word reading; comprehension
- Writing – transcription; spelling; handwriting; composition, grammar, punctuation and vocabulary.

Mathematics

- Number
- Measurement
- Geometry
- Statistics

Science

- Working scientifically
- Plants
- Animals, including humans
- Everyday materials
- Seasonal changes
- Habitats
- Rocks
- Light
- Electricity
- Forces
- States of matter
- Earth and space
- Evolution

History

- Must cover Stone age to Iron Age; Roman Empire; Anglo Saxons and Scots; Vikings; local history; something in British History beyond 1066; early civilisation; Ancient Greece; a non-European society
- Allowed to add extra elements in
- Victorians, WWII, Tudors

Languages

- Only from Key Stage 2
